## Herrgott Stays On As Council Tables Resignation

### Civic Groups Join League To Oppose Multiple Housing

Mountainside's three largest civic organizations — Pembroke, Concord Estates and Sherwood Forest — have banded together to form a community-wide organization pledged to press for a denial of variances for multiple dwellings.

Evergreen, president of the Pembroke Association, the named coordinator of action for the new group, has been named Vice Chairman of the League of Mountainside.

Swanson, Harriet S., 1621 Nottingham, who and Robert Lawrie, 1586 Broadmoor, are serving as temporary co-chairs of the League. Simon is president of Sherwood Forest Association and head of Concord Estates.

In addition to the major civic organizations, several smaller groups are already pressing for preventing the erection of multiple dwellings, including town and garden apartments.

#### Others Invited

Members of six other groups sat in on the organizational meeting held at Simon's home. Other residents, affiliated with the group, are invited to join the effort. Simon said:

Simon, who stressed the fact that the individual organizations will still function before and after the League is formed mainly because in the past some of the organizations acting individually have been ignored by the Borough Council and the Planning Board. The League will enable all the residents of the boroughs to band together to keep Mountainside a residential community.

In the past the board of adjustments has "ignored" the wishes of residents in granting variances, according to Simon. Only vigorous action taken by the civic associations, principally the Pembroke Association, has prevented RT 22, west of New Providence rd., from becoming loaded with banks, tanks and used car lots, Simon said.

#### Lot Size 'Inadequate'

A long-range aim of the Civic Association League is an increase in the minimum lot size, which is now 100 by 150 feet. The erection of big ranch houses, which occupy a large part of such a parcel of land, and the installation of pools in many back yards make the present minimum lot size inadequate, Simon stated.

Pembroke, Sherwood Forest and Concord Estates Associations have been actively opposing a recommendation reported to be included in a master plan now being prepared by Herbert H. Smith Associates which calls for erection of multiple dwellings.

Albert Hartung, president of the Planning Board, had expected the final report of Smith Associates to be in his hands Monday, in time for presentation at Monday night's meeting of the board. However, despite a letter from the firm setting Aug. 31 as the date the report would be in, it had not reached his hands by the time promised, Hartung said.





# 'If The Grass Is Always Greener... See County 'Farm Agent' Peterson

By BARBARA GIBBONS  
"What's wrong with my lawn?"  
That's been bothering Mr. Suburbanite take comfort in the knowledge that the same question is probably on your neighbor's lips too according to grass expert Eric H. Peterson, the Union County Agricultural Agent.

Peterson notes that a nationwide survey of agricultural agents in suburban areas demonstrates that more people want to know "What's wrong with my lawn" than all other gardening questions combined.

Most people ask their neighbors, but an increasing number of knowledgeable subscribers are asking the County agricultural agent for his expert advice about their lawn growing problems. Free expert advice is just one of the many services of this public agency.

**NATURALLY, PETERSON ISN'T** about to take a trip out to your quarter-acre to make a personal investigation of the brown grass around your pad—but he'll do the next best thing. He'll listen to your problems on the phone, or read your letter if you write to him, and based on what you tell him, he'll diagnose your lawn's ailment and prescribe the appropriate remedy, if there is one.

Another of the county agricultural agent's free services is the free pH test of your soil—a chemical procedure to determine the alkalinity or acidity of your dirt. The results will tell you what to add in order to make your soil a comfortable habitat for the plants you plan to grow.

To make this test, Peterson will need about a pint of soil from your property, preferably from a variety of locations mixed together. Before you mail him a chunk of dirt, however, Peterson advises you to send for a leaflet giving complete directions for taking soil samples. Write to County Agricultural Agent, T. Bridge St., Elizabeth, and include your home address. In case the sample is properly prepared he can't make the test.

Peterson reports that several occasions he has homeowners trudge into his office with enough dirt to plant Christmas trees. Usually a man and his neighbor patted into his office hefting a garbage can full of dirt for a soil test. At the other extreme, his secretary has opened
